organized on the occasion of the 100th anniversary of the publication of Milanković's theory of climate change, this Third Announcement provides updated information on the event and the instructions to the presenters and other participants.

**Introductory Information / Rationale**

In 2020, the Association Milutin Milanković organized a symposium to mark the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the publication of Milanković's book "Mathematical Theory of Thermal Phenomena Caused by Solar Insolation," published by Gauthier -Villars in Paris. In that book, Milanković presented the foundations of the astronomical influence of solar energy and its relationship with climate change on Earth.

The theory of climate change was further elaborated over several years with inputs from Wladimir Köppen and Alfred Wegener. This theory gained wider scientific recognition when Milanković's papers were included in their book "Climates of the Past" and through a lecture delivered by Alfred Wegener at the Congress of Naturalists in Innsbruck in 1924.

### **The objectives of the conference presented in the First Announcement are:**

- to use the fundamental contribution of Milanković's theory of climate changes to understand and anticipate what could be expected to occur in the next 100 years because of climate changes, both due to natural long-term processes and to anthropogenic factors,
- to enable profound understanding of the influences that global changes in nature have on the human lives and to propose practical measures that the human civilization should take to prevent negative influence on the climate change and the related weather extremes,
- to present and quantify the measures to reduce risk and threat concerning public health and wellbeing due to changes in climatic conditions and weather extremes.

### **Official Language of the Conference and the Opening Session**

The conference will be held in English. Only the opening session will be bilingual. All other sessions in both days will be in English. The first working session will introduce conference topics in the form of their three keynote talks.

### **Presentations and Publications**

The organizers are pleased to announce that 40 papers have been selected for oral presentations. This includes eight invited / keynote talks. There will be no poster or online presentations. The authors of several presentations who are unable to attend have been given consent by the organizers to record and submit their talk, including PP presentations, of maximum duration of 15 minutes. These presentations will be included in the regular sessions.

**Abstracts:** The authors of all accepted papers should have submitted their abstracts, which will be printed in the booklet of the conference abstracts and will be delivered to the attending participants during the registration.

**Full-length papers:** All authors need to submit full length paper prior to the Conference. The instructions for manuscript preparations are available on the link:

All these papers will be included in the conference proceedings which will be published in electronic (PDF) form and will be delivered to the authors.

The proceedings will have its identification codes (**doi and ISBN**) for referencing.

- **Submission of the video recorded presentation** using **mp4** or **avi** format, (by the authors who got the consent of the organizers) containing PP presentation, max. duration of 20 min for keynote, 15 min for other presentations, **November 1st, 2024**
- **Submission of PP files for oral presentations: November 2nd, 2024**
- **Submission of final papers: November 3<sup>rd</sup> 2024.** The authors of the accepted papers have received detailed instructions for manuscript preparation. Authors are responsible for the originality, quality, and accuracy of their data.

### **Conference Fee**

There is no conference fee. Attendance to the Conference is free to all registered participants.

### **Meals and Refreshments**

Conference lunches (luncheons), coffees and light refreshments will be provided on 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> November at no charge to all attending participants in the Lecture Hall Milutin Milanković at the Faculty of Civil Engineering.

The Conference dinner, free for the registered participants: 4<sup>th</sup> November at the Restaurant “Kod Vuka”, 5 min walk from the conference venue, entrance from the park side.

### **Accommodation**

There is a broad range of hotels, apartments, and hostels available through regular booking agencies. Some participants have already been booked at the limited number of the university accommodation.

We recommend two hotels:

- a. **Palace hotel** (<https://palacehotel.rs/>), traditional, modestly priced (approx. €75-80) in the pedestrian zone of the city center, 3-5 min to Knez Mihailova street main shopping and vibrant/friendly open air cafes/restaurants, and Kalemegdan fortress/park, about 25 min walk or 10 min taxi ride to the Conference venue and
- b. **Metropol Palace** (<https://www.metropolpalace.com/>), recently refurbished (4.5-5 stars), 3 min walk to the conference venue, 20 min walk to the city center.

### **Travel and transfer from and to the airport**

Belgrade is well connected to all major international airports in Europe, America and China. For the transfer from the airport to the city centre we strongly recommend you take a voucher from the official taxi counter at the arrival hall of the Nikola Tesla airport. The fixed price of RSD3000 (approx. €27) to the city center, pay to the driver at the end of the ride. Back to the airport, it is advisable to book your taxi in advance (local taxi companies' numbers: 19801, 19802, 19803, 19804 and 19805). Otherwise ask the hotel reception to book a regular (not executive) taxi for you. Pay by meter at the end of the ride.

### **Weather**

Autumn days in Belgrade can be both sunny and mildly warm and rainy, windy, and cold. It is advisable to have a look at the short-term weather prediction before the travel.

### **Local currency**

Dinar (RSD). Exchange rate 1€ = 117 RSD. Most of the international credit and debit cards are accepted in hotels, restaurants, and shops.
